'PEACE BE WITH YOU'


These are the first words of the Risen Christ to his anxious disciples and they are his first words to us today as we seek to meet our Lord. This is the normal Jewish greeting but it was special for the disciples because they were gathered together in fear that they also would be persecuted as our Lord was. Jesus then said "As the Father has sent me, so am I sending you". The Risen Lord always wants to bring us peace and comfort. Jesus breaks down the barrier between us and God, thereby making us the beloved children of the Father. Unfortunately, Thomas was not with the other disciples when Jesus made this statement. Yet when the risen Jesus did appear to him, he did not touch Jesus' wounds but expressed his faith in the great cry "My Lord and my God". Thomas made a greater statement of faith than any other disciple. He really understood what Jesus' Resurrection meant. We should aim to follow Thomas and make a similar statement though we do not see Him, this will allow us to be open to the blessing He wants to give us.
