New Guidelines for Mass and other Liturgical Services in Church

- **Sanitise hands on entry & exit.**
- **Follow signs & listen to stewards .**
- **Wear a mask or face coverings all the time in church. If you have any serious breathing problem or health issues please inform one of the stewards. Children under 5 are exempted.**
- **Avoid touching walls, door handles, etc... as much as possible.**
- **To light a candle please ask one of the stewards. Do not touch the candles under any circumstances.**

It seems very clear that Jesus was familiar with the agricultural practices of his day because he drew on this knowledge in many of his parables. The parable of the wheat and weeds (darnel) on which we are reflecting in today's Gospel, is a good example. God not only gives us life, but also gives us a lifetime to determine how we wish to live our lives - for good or evil. So, whether our span of life is long or short, he always gives us sufficient time to determine its direction and its final end. The Church teaches that the final destiny of our moral life is how we have lived our lives. God rewards all who choose to live a good upright life. The righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of the Father. He wants us to make the right choices so that we can be rewarded and shine like the sun in his kingdom. 'Lord, help me to hear and understand your Word. Let your Holy Spirit work in me for the growth of your kingdom'.
