Dear Parishioners,

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. In the Catholic Church, the new Liturgical Year commences with the first Sunday of Advent. As we begin this new year, the Church does not just indicate the beginning of a year, but the beginning of a renewed commitment to the faith by all those who follow Christ, the true light of the world.

The season of Advent is also a time of waiting and watching for the coming of the Lord Jesus. The entire Liturgy of the Advent season invites us to lift our gaze and open our hearts to welcome the mystery of the Word Incarnate, who will give the 'Light in this time of uncertainty, fear and challenge the Coronavirus. As we enter into this season of Advent let us remember the words of St John Henry Newman: "Advent is a time of waiting, it is a time of joy because the coming of Christ is not only a gift of grace and salvation but it is also a time of commitment because it motivates us to live the present as a time of responsibility and vigilance". The words of this great Saint rejuvenate us to live this time of waiting not just to celebrate a historical event but to repeat this event in our lives and in the service of others.

There are so many ways and symbols that enlighten us to prepare for the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Advent Wreath is one of the most iconic symbols of Advent. It is a beautiful symbol of the eternity of Christ and his presence in our lives. As a symbol, apart from being lit on each of the Sundays of Advent, it also has a deeper meaning. The entire Advent Wreath has a richness which offers a real opportunity for reflecting in a prayerful way on this beautiful season of preparation for Christmas. The candles symbolise the light of Christ coming into the world. The evergreen symbolises renewal and the circular

Each candle on the wreath has its theme of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love as they are lit on the appropriate Sunday of Advent. As we begin our Advent Journey this year in lockdown, I invite you all, when you come to church, to pray with a focus on each candle as this can really help us to focus our preparation for Christmas.


