THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE PROPHET AND THEIR TEACHING IN OUR LIVES

In the First Reading Prophet Moses says: "Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen". This is one of those passages in the Bible referred to as the messianic prophesies. We see in the history of the Old Testament that the Prophets played a vital role in bringing people closer to God. Prophets were the mediators between God and the people. This prophecy from Moses reveals to us that God promised his people the Messiah. This promise was fulfilled in Christ. Jesus Christ is the great prophet for all times.

In today's Gospel Reading Mark says that his teaching made a deep impression on them, because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. This makes a clear distinction between the teaching of Jesus and that of the Scribes, the official interpreters of the Torah or Law of the Jews. The teaching of Jesus had a great impact on the People. In what way was it different from the teaching of the scribes? The words of Jesus had the power to move people's hearts because He spoke with his own voice, his own authority. We tend to associate authority with people in positions of power in society, like political or religious leaders, people we identify as 'authority figures'. But Jesus teaches us that there is another kind of authority, a moral authority, that has nothing to do with holding official positions of power or influence. It is the highest authority of all and has its roots in the authority of God. Jesus possessed this kind of authority in a unique way. As his followers, baptised in his name, and called to be his witnesses, we, too, share in his authority. Even in this time of uncertainty and anxiety, as new variants of Covid-19 continue to hold our fearful world in lock-down, we are called to reflect the authority of Jesus and to Fr. Vincent Arulandhu SCJ be beacons of hope for the people of our time.
