Today's Mass Readings

Job 7:1-4, 6-7; Ps 146; I Corinthians 9:19-19,22-23; Mark 1:29-39.

DO WE SEEK JESUS?

The First Reading presents us the dilemma of Job. He was a righteous man, an innocent and faithful servant of God, but we also hear him clearly express his feelings of suffering and pain. He speaks of sleepless nights, a loss of hope and months of misery. These feelings are not just something that happened to Job but they are real and everyone experiences them at times.

Job's faith was severely tested by the devil. He lost everything but it did not change his decisions. He did not give in to ultimate despair rather he persevered by being faithful to God. His tragedy of losing everything that was precious to him did not make him to lose his faith and hope in his God. His faithfulness and perseverance made him praise God by saying; "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return there; the Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

Job's situation reminds us of our own daily struggles with the problems of life. Above all, it reminds us that at times, it seems to us that we experience the silence or the absence of God in our lives. They are terrible moments that make us ask questions like: God, where are you? Why me? What have I done wrong? God answers these questions through His Son Jesus in today's Gospel Reading.

The evangelist Mark presents Jesus to us as a healer. He heals Peter's mother-in-law and every sick person who comes to their house. Jesus preached, healed and delivered people from all kinds of infirmities and problems. There was no one who encountered him with faith that he did not heal. The question is: Do we seek Jesus like the people in the Gospel? Are we faithful to God like Job?
