LENT IS A TIME TO RENEW OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

The Season of Lent deepens our awareness that we have a Covenant with the living God. We are not just people who believe in God. We are a people formed by God and a people with a special relationship with God. When we are deeply aware of His love then we truly begin to repent in a Christian way. The First Reading reveals the unconditional relationship between God and Noah, who represents humanity.

God has been faithful to his covenant, to the extent of offering his own son Jesus Christ in order to renew it. Unfortunately, humanity has at times been unfaithful to God and his covenant. Therefore, this Lent, God offers us another opportunity to renew our covenant with him through Christ.

The Gospel Reading narrates the temptation of Jesus. Here, we are told that Jesus went into the desert immediately after his baptism, led by the Spirit and he remained there for 40 days. The fact that Jesus spent 40 days in the desert is significant. This recalls the 40 years that the Israelites wandered in the desert after being led from slavery in Egypt. The prophet Elijah also journeyed in the desert for 40 days and nights, making his way to Horeb, the mountain of God, where he was also supported by an angel of the Lord. Remembering the significance of these events, we also set aside 40 days for the season of Lent.

Jesus' action of going into the desert has two purposes. Firstly, he could be alone and commune with the Father through prayer and fasting for forty days and nights. Secondly, he would experience what every human being undergoes, especially temptation and suffering. Jesus continues to share our life and to be Emmanuel, God with us. During Lent, we may be led by the Holy Spirit to reject temptations and to follow Jesus' footsteps.


