#### **CLEANSING THE TEMPLE**



### Today's Mass Readings

Exodus 20: 1-17; Ps 18; 1 Corinthians 1:22-25; John 2:13-25

In today's Gospel reading we hear about Jesus overturning the tables of the merchants and the moneychangers in the Temple at Jerusalem. This action reveals Jesus' anger. Jesus' passion turns to anger when he sees the Temple of Jerusalem being desecrated. A place of prayer has been turned into a market. So, Jesus makes a whip of cord and drives the merchants out along with their cattle and sheep. To understand the relevance of Jesus' action, we must learn more about the activities that were going on in the temple area. The Jews considered the Temple of Jerusalem as the centre of their religious, social and commercial life. Every year, during Passover, they went to the Temple. The Passover feast recalls the liberation of the people from Egypt through the saving act of God. So, during this time, people came to the Temple to fulfil their obligations to God. Therefore, worship at the Temple included animal sacrifice and so merchants sold animals to worshippers. The Temple also played a significant role in Jesus' life from his earliest years. His parents used to travel to Jerusalem every year for the feast of the Passover. When he was twelve years old he remained in the Temple for three days, listening to the doctors of the Law and asking them questions.

Hence, Jesus' anger was not directed against the Temple, rather to the powerful Temple authorities who had turned Temple worship into a lucrative business for themselves. So, Jesus challenged the Jewish authorities by saying; "Destroy this temple, and in three days, I will raise it up." He was speaking about the temple of his body referring to his physical body as the Temple. According to St Paul, we are the Temple of the Holy Spirit. So, as we continue our Lenten journey let us cleanse our heart from selfish motives and sins. May our heart be a worthy dwelling place for God.

#### SVP UPDATE, HOLY NAME PARISH
