us to contemplate Jesus as the Good Shepherd. This is a most lovely and ancient way of coming close to our Blessed Lord. The image of the shepherd is portrayed in the Bible many times. In the Old Testament, God is seen as the shepherd who takes care of his flock. Prophet Isaiah says that "He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against His breast and leading the mother ewes to their rest." In today's Gospel Reading, Jesus proclaims "I am the good shepherd". This proclamation of Jesus recalls how God introduced himself to Moses as "I am". So Jesus by using this expression reveals himself as the Son of God and the fulfilment of the prophecies of the good shepherd. This also emphasises the self-sacrificing element in his own life: "The good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep." It is this love that led Jesus to the cross on which He sacrificed his life for his flock. This testifies that Jesus knows his sheep. He knows when they are hungry, thirsty, weak and wounded. To love is to know. There is no love without knowledge. Unlike hired men who work only for their wages and do not defend their flock against attacks but take to their heels and leave the sheep to be attacked and scattered in fear and terror. Jesus the Good Shepherd never forsakes his flock in time of danger but stays with them even unto death. These are images that readily move us to be closer to Jesus in a sense of our need and our gratitude for his love and care. Today is also Vocations Sunday. On this day we are especially asked to pray that the Church may be provided with the leaders needed to do its work of spreading the Gospel.

May the Good Shepherd guide and strengthen us in the pathway of constant kindness, especially at this time of trial. May he restore in us all a deep sense of our vocation to be with him, to live in him and to work through him, every day.
