### EXPERIENCE THE LOVE AND MERCY OF GOD

On this Second Sunday of Easter, the church celebrates the feast of Divine Mercy. John in today's Gospel reading provides us with an account of what Jesus did after His Resurrection. Jesus came and stood among his disciples as they had gathered behind locked doors. They were still scared of their enemies in spite of receiving the good news that their master was alive and they sat huddled together in that house. In case there was any doubt about him, he showed them his hands which had been pierced with nails. He gave them the normal Jewish greeting of 'Shalom' which means Peace. The presence of Jesus was the sign of peace.

The resurrection of Jesus was a new experience to the disciples. Even though Jesus had constantly explained to them about his rising from the dead, they were unable to grasp the implication of it. It was not something the disciples of Jesus could have anticipated, but now they were confronted with a new experience of their master. The encounter with the Risen Christ helps them to move from fear to joy, seclusion to mission, absence to presence, disbelief to faith, mere existence to new life. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on the disciples and through the Spirit they enter into the second creation leading them into something even greater. Jesus gives them peace and the power to forgive sins. The forgiveness that Jesus speaks of is not just the juridical wiping away of sins but a deep reconciliation of people with God and with each other. Here, Jesus restored their peace, and commissioned them as ministers of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the Sacrament of Love and Mercy.

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we are reminded that God extended his mercy to us by allowing his Son to pay the ransom for our sins. Christ accomplished this through his Paschal Mystery. Let us extend this mercy to others and let us be disciples of mercy.
