Dear Parishioners,

As you all know that the Government has updated its response roadmap for the easing of COVID-19 restrictions to combat the virus. Following the Government's update, the Catholic Bishop's Conference of England and Wales has prepared a general guidance for all the parishes or place of worship.

The following are the General Guidance:

- At the moment, we are requested to continue sanitising hands on entry and exit.
- Taking Names for Track and Trace purposes.
- Keep Social distancing at Holy Name 2 metres- all the time when you are in Church for Mass and other Liturgical Services.
- At Holy Name the Covid-Secure capacity is 80 Households.
- Holy Water Stoups are not permitted.
- Congregational Singing is still prohibited. However, the parish choir (no more than 6 people) is allowed to sing for the Masses.
- Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind only and the minister should wear a face covering. It is now permitted to announce "The Body of Christ" for each Communicant. The minister should sanitise his/her hands before and after distributing communion.
- Home Visits can now take place by Priests, Deacons, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and other volunteers. They are requested to follow the Government Guidance.
- Prayer Groups, Catechetical and Faith Formation groups can now resume their activities in church, the centre or in the office.

Finally, the capacity for Requiem Masses and Funeral Services will be the Covid-secure capacity of the church which is 80 households at Holy Name.


