Today's Mass Readings

Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24; Ps 29; 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mark 5:21-43 (Mk 5:21-24, 35-43)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's Gospel Reading proclaims two healing stories in which Jesus is the source of healing. One story tells us about a father's great love for his dying daughter. The other story tells us about a desperate woman who puts herself at risk as she seeks healing from Jesus. In each story, the request for healing is a courageous act of faith, and yet very different situations are represented to indicate the lives of each suffering person in the world.

Jairus was a synagogue official and an important man in the Jewish community. He was distressed by his daughter's worsening illness, so he approached Jesus to ask healing for his daughter. He did this by falling to Jesus' knees and earnestly pleaded with Him to lay His hands on her and heal her. This gesture showed his courage and humility. Though he was an important man in his community, he swallowed his pride, abandoned his dignity and fell at the feet of Jesus because he had recognised Jesus' healing power. As Jesus accompanied Jairus to his house, the Evangelist Mark introduces a second person to us, who sought healing from Jesus. The woman, who was suffering from continued haemorrhages for twelve years, came up behind Jesus in the crowd and touched his cloak. "If I can touch even his clothes, she said, I shall be well again". In response, Jesus turned and asked who touched him. The woman, who was now healed, approached in fear and trembling and fell at the feet of Jesus and told Him the whole truth. Jesus responded by acknowledging her faith and sent her away with the words: 'My daughter, your faith has restored you to health: go in peace and be free from your sickness.'

These two miracle stories reveal that it is faith that leads them to seek out Jesus in their distress and that brings about his miraculous response. In a world where sickness and loss are still present realities, the miracle stories remind us of the Lord's healing kindness. The faith of Jairus and of the woman with the haemorrhage invites us to reflect on our own faith in Jesus and take steps to nurture and develop it.


