

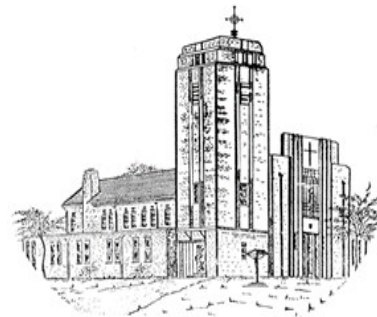

### Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the history of time, God continues to draw us to himself to save, feed, and strengthen us on our journey. This Sunday's Readings provide us another opportunity to continue our reflection on the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the mystery of our faith, and the life of the world.

In this Bread of Life discourse, Jesus continues to teach us that He is the Bread of Life that he was sent by God to do the Father's will. Jesus promises that those who look upon the Son with faith will find eternal life.

Jesus as the Bread of Life is linked to his life-giving death on the Cross. Unlike the manna that nourished the Israelites temporarily during their journey in the desert, Jesus is the bread come down from heaven, who gives us life eternal. But this bread comes at a cost 'The bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world.' This is the bread we receive in the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is the memorial of the Last Supper. In the Eucharist, we commemorate and re-enact the greatest act of love the world has ever known. Jesus' last act before his death on Calvary was to share a meal with those he had chosen. The meaning of Christ's last meal is inseparable from his sacrificial death, his perfect act of love. Love is manifested supremely in self-sacrifice: 'there is no greater love than this that a person would lay down his life for the sake of his friends'. All this is revealed in his words: 'I am the living bread that comes down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever'.

Nourished by the Bread of Eternal Life, we are challenged to continue our Christian journey in good and bad times, until, like the prophet Elijah, we reach the mountain of God, our eternal home. Let us pray that we will be ever more open to the life that Jesus, the Living Bread, gives us. May we will welcome Christ on our journey; and take the time to taste and savour the goodness of the Lord in our everyday lives.

## **CURRENT COVID -19 ARRANGEMENTS AT HOLY NAME**

### **What has not changed:**

1. Names and contact numbers will be noted for Track and Trace
2. Sanitising of hands on entry and exit
3. Face Covering - we strongly advise that people continue to wear face coverings in church
4. Social distancing for those who wish will be available in the side aisles
5. Communion will be brought to those seated on the side aisles
6. For those socially distancing, exit from the church will be via the Blessed Sacrament chapel and then through the side door at the back.

### **What has changed:**

1. Social distancing has been removed from the two centre aisles. You may sit where you wish
2. At the Offertory, the collection bags will be brought to you by the stewards.
3. To receive Holy Communion in the centre aisles you are invited to approach the Altar. Please follow the instructions from the Stewards
4. Exit at the end of the Mass is via the main door. Please be patient to allow people to exit calmly.
