Today's Mass Readings

Apocalypse 11:19; 12:-6, 10; Ps 44; 1 Corinthians 15:20-26; Luke 1:39-56

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In his Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium, Pope Francis says that 'On the cross, Christ led us to Mary. He brought us to her because he did not want us to journey without a mother'. She is the friend who is ever concerned that wine not be lacking in our lives. She is the woman whose heart was pierced by a sword and who understands all our pain. As mother of all, she is a sign of hope for people who are suffering in the world. This is manifested when we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary this Sunday.

Mary's bodily Assumption into heaven reveals that her body was incorruptible. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary was defined as a dogma of faith by Pope Pius XII in 1950 in his Apostolic Constitution - Munificentissimus Deus.

By her Assumption into heaven, Mary shares with her divine Son the unity of body and soul after earthly life, and in doing this, they both help us to anticipate that moment of our own, when our souls and bodies will once again be reunited at the end of time. This is the wonderful assurance that God has given us through revelation and tradition, filling us with confidence in the resurrection of the body, and in the re-unification of body and soul in the life to come.

Mary's Assumption into heaven is not only the salvation of her spirit. It brings us a ray of hope. Our hope involves our whole beings - body, spirit and soul. We have bodies made in the image and likeness of God. We are not disembodied spirits. Neither are we simply bodies subject only to our emotions and desires. We have minds that are capable of thinking and hoping and our souls thirst for God.

So, we are coming through this covid epidemic. Many have died prematurely, others been left poor by the economic consequences. The sick have had much needed treatment delayed. Many children have missed out on their education. There has been great heroism by many hospital staff amongst others. There has been much kindness by strangers to their shielding neighbours. Hope has been lived. May we as Christian people flourish in hope. We trust and hope in the intercession of Mary, who was bodily assumed into heaven.

CURRENT COVID -19 ARRANGEMENTS AT HOLY NAME

What has not changed:

- 1. Names and contact numbers will be noted for Track and Trace
- 2. Sanitising of hands on entry and exit
- Face Covering we strongly advise that people continue to wear face coverings in church
- 4. Social distancing for those who wish will be available in the side aisles
- 5. Communion will be brought to those seated on the side aisles
- For those socially distancing, exit from the church will be via the Blessed Sacrament chapel and then through the side door at the back.

What has changed:
