#### **Dear Brothers and Sisters,**

We are invited to dwell the words of Peter: "Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life". Jesus has come, not only to save us but also to give us fullness of life: "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly". This is what we have seen in the Gospel Readings during the last few Sundays in a row. In these Readings we have heard that Jesus fed hungry people by multiplying the five loaves of bread and two fish. He taught: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Believe in me and you will never hunger and thirst anymore." More importantly he said, "The bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world".

In his teachings, Jesus did not just give us material food; he gave us food from heaven. Jesus did not just give us bread; he has become bread for us so that we can be one with him and have life in its fullness. Peter and the rest of the Apostles realized this, though they did not fully comprehend the words of Jesus like the rest of his listeners. However, they were convinced that Jesus is telling the truth: "We have come to believe that you are the Holy One of God." After all, the truth remains the truth, whether we understand it or not.

In today's Gospel Reading, our Lord Jesus Christ ends his teaching on the Eucharist by challenging his listeners to choose to accept his teachings that lead to life or leave him for an uncertain fate. Like Joshua in the First Reading, he takes time to explain to them why they need to make a choice and where it would lead them. As a matter of choice, many people could not accept his teaching and left him.

The same invitation to make a choice is given to us today. We hear people say, it is a free world, which is true. However, we are also invited to make responsible choices in the so-called free world as our choices determine our chances and the changes we experience in life. When Jesus Christ challenged the apostles to choose as the people were leaving him and going back to their former way of life, Peter replying on behalf of others said, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life".

What choice will you be making today in your personal life, in your family, in your relationship with others, and ultimately in your Christian life journey with God?



#### **CURRENT COVID -19 ARRANGEMENTS AT HOLY NAME**

#### What has not changed:

- 1. Names and contact numbers will be noted for Track and Trace
- 2. Sanitising of hands on entry and exit
- Face Covering we strongly advise that people continue to wear face coverings in church
- 4. Social distancing for those who wish will be available in the side aisles
- 5. Communion will be brought to those seated on the side aisles
- 6. For those socially distancing, exit from the church will be via the Blessed Sacrament chapel and then through the side door at the back.

#### What has changed:

- 1. Social distancing has been removed from the two centre aisles. You may sit where you wish
- At the Offertory, the collection bags will be brought to you by the stewards.
- To receive Holy Communion in the centre aisles you are invited to approach the Altar. Please follow the instructions from the Stewards
- 4. Exit at the end of the Mass is via the main door. Please be patient to allow people to exit calmly.
