### Today's Mass Readings

Wisdom 2:12, 17-20; Ps 53; James 3:16-4:3; Mark 9:30-37

#### **Dear Brothers and Sisters,**

We hear Jesus once again predict his passion, death, and Resurrection to his disciples. The setting is important for his prediction. Jesus and his disciples were preparing to journey through Galilee, a Jewish territory in which Jesus had already encountered problems with the Pharisees and the Scribes. Perhaps this is the reason that Jesus was trying to journey in secret. By foretelling his passion, Jesus was acknowledging the danger his disciples would face and therefore Jesus was trying to prepare his disciples for it. Nevertheless, the disciples did not understand what Jesus was saying and were afraid to ask what he meant.

As they arrived and entered a house in Capernaum, Jesus asked his disciples about the argument they had while they were journeying but the disciples were uncharacteristically silent and afraid to answer. Their argument was about the earthly government they imagined that Christ had come to establish. Like the community that James wrote to in today's Second Reading, Jesus' disciples were experiencing a conflict of interest. We often see this in any society, church, family, and anywhere that personal ambition is considered more important than anything else.

Because of this Jesus teaches both his disciples and us who is the greatest in the Kingdom and that those who would be first in God's kingdom must be servants of all. Here Jesus took a child as an example for us today, Jesus is teaching us that we have to become like children to be great. We might easily fail to understand the significance of this action. In first-century Palestine, children were without status or power, possessing no legal rights. In this action, Jesus is teaching his disciples and us that when we serve the least among us, we serve Jesus himself.
