Today's Mass Readings

Genesis 2:18-24; Ps 127; Hebrews 2:9-11; Mark 10: 2-16

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Readings of this Sunday speak to us about the significance and importance of the institutions of marriage and family. These two are essential institutions founded on genuine love for the sustenance of humanity.

As Jesus was teaching his disciples and people, the Pharisees approach Jesus and ask a question about the lawfulness of divorce to trap Jesus. Under specific conditions, divorce was an accepted practice among the Jewish people during the time of Jesus. It is important to notice that the way they put the question to Jesus - 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife', they didn't ask "is it against the law for a woman to divorce her husband?" Divorce was a very real issue for the Jews at the time of Jesus as indeed it is today in many Christian churches. According to the Jewish teaching, adultery was the only reason for divorce.

To answer their question, Jesus recalls the creation story in Genesis that God's original plan was that man and woman would become one flesh in marriage. God's Plan reveals the truth that both man and woman are made in God's image and likeness. Therefore, Jesus tells us quite clearly that divorce is not part of God's plan. God's dream is that a man and woman who married are called to mirror the fidelity of God. A married couple is asked to reflect the covenant love of God for his people, as God never fails in his promise of fidelity to us. For Jesus, marriage is a gift from God. Marriage is a celebration of creation and of God's love. Finally, these two Readings present a strong picture of Jesus' emphasis on the importance of family and their relationship with God. Parents and families bear witness to the Kingdom of God.
