Today's Mass Readings

Numbers 11:25-29; Ps 18; James 5: 1-6; Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Whoever is not against us, is for us!" These are the words from Moses and Jesus that we hear in our readings this Sunday. They are very powerful. They are very applicable to our current times in the Church and the World. There is so much conflict and division in our world, church, country, communities, families, and if we are honest, even within ourselves. If this is the case then how do we solve these divisions, and how do we work toward resolution, reconciliation, and unity? The truth is God is bigger than every human assumption and measure. That is the only way to truly understand God and accept His will.

The First Reading reveals for us an important message about the mission of Moses. When his responsibility became very burdensome to him, God decided to give him helping hands. Joshua, who had served Moses from his youth, said that two men, Eldad and Medad, who were not among the seventy men chosen by Moses, received the Spirit of God and prophesied like the others to the people.

In the Gospel Reading, the apostle John has a similar experience to Joshua, saying "Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him." In these two stories, we see the envious attitude of the chosen ones. They were afraid and worried because these men outside their fold, whom the Lord chose and anointed with His Spirit were a threat to their mission and position. So, instead of seeing them as fellow workers in God's mission, they became jealous and despised them. However, Moses and Jesus were against the spirit of envy and oppression. We should not strangle the true spirit of God at work in people, rather we should help them to advance and to grow spiritually in doing God's will and his mission.
