# **Dear Brothers and Sisters,**

At this time in autumn when the harvest has been collected, the Church celebrates the Feast of All Saints. This feast reminds us of another harvest, the great harvest of goodness and holiness which is represented by the saints who have gone before us. This harvest has sprung from the presence of the love and the grace of the Lord, in the lives of those who have remained faithful to God over the centuries.

On this feast day, we have the Gospel of the Beatitudes. This teaching proclaims that we are capable of great sanctity and heroism. The first chapter of the Bible says that all creation was good. Moreover, man and woman were created as 'very good'. This reveals to us that we are offered an intimate relationship with God, who created us in the divine image and likeness. We have an idea of human nature which says that God so loved the world that he sent his Son Jesus to be the Lamb of God, who takes away our sins, so that our bodies might become Temples of the Holy Spirit.

The Feast of All Saints therefore is not just about the next world. It is about the way we are called to live today. The Beatitudes do not encourage us to sit back and do nothing. Being a Christian means belonging to a communion; you cannot be an isolated Christian, just caring for and thinking about yourself. The Communion of Saints is about the link with those who have gone before us, but the doctrine of the Communion of the Saints also demands that we look towards those who are beside us. It demands that we become saints to those around us – our children, our spouses, our community, our society – showing what it means to be the Church and what it means to witness to the love and the mercy of God revealed in Jesus Christ.

This week, all roads lead to the cemeteries. We are reminded that it is not only a day for the dead but for all saints. As we gather around the tomb of our loved ones, we not only pray for them but we also ask them to pray for us. Hopefully, part of our prayer is for them to guide and lead us to become saints too.
