Today's Mass Readings

Micah 5:1-4; Ps 79; Hebrews 10:5-10; Luke 1:39-45

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Advent - the final Sunday before Christmas. Today's Liturgy give us Mary, the humble maid of Nazareth, to imitate as she was the one who first welcomed Christ at the first Christmas. The Gospel passage recounts the moving story of Mary's visit to her elderly cousin, Elizabeth.

The lovely story of Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth has rich significance. It is the story of two mothers-to-be sharing their joy at becoming the bearers of the incredible miracle of new life. However, the Visitation story, as told by Luke, has deeper meaning. The Visitation is a meeting of joy and faith. As soon as Mary enters into the presence of Elizabeth, Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit and praises Mary for her faith and trust in God: "Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Both Mary and Elizabeth already anticipated the joy of God's presence and salvation unfolding before them. This beautiful meeting leads us into the very centre of Advent, namely the prayerful anticipation of the mystery of the Incarnation.

The importance of Christmas today suffers from consumerism. In this way we enjoy anticipating Christmas. We exchange gifts, hold Christmas parties, sing songs, visit relatives and Godparents, decorate lavishly and buy new things for ourselves, etc. Nonetheless, the Visitation story helps us to ask these questions: Do we share our faith? Do we talk about the great event of the Incarnation? Do we share how Christmas has affected our relationship with God? Do we marvel at the love of God and the great sacrifice Jesus had made for us? It seems that we do everything to make Christmas unforgettable but we choose to forget about sharing our faith.

Mary is a model and symbol of faith and joy. May we be like Mary, open and cooperative in God's plan for salvation.

I wish you a Blessed and Peaceful Christmas, particularly those who are unable to attend the Christmas Mass once again this year. May the blessings of Christmas embrace you and your family.

CATHOLIC BISHOPS' CONFERENCE OF ENGLAND & WALES - PRACTICAL GUIDANCE FOR CHURCHES

With respect to the current situation with the Omicron variant it is important to ensure the following points are followed in our churches:

- That people displaying any symptoms of covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.
- That hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church.
- Face coverings must be worn by those attending public acts of worship unless there is a genuine exemption or the person is leading worship or participating in a role that requires the mask to be removed for a period of time.
- That there is good ventilation and air throughput in the building; in this case, because of climatic conditions, it would be important to remind people to wrap up well in church!
- That a positive message encouraging people to get vaccinated and have the booster jab when able is delivered whenever possible (bearing in mind that the 40+ age group can apply for the booster vaccination, and that the period between 2nd dose and booster is reduced to 12 weeks).
- That people who are engaged in a form of pastoral ministry which involves ministry to the housebound, sick and vulnerable, should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure they are safe to do so. These are free from the NHS.
