MY DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST

In today's Gospel, Jesus urges us to focus more on ourselves, then change will be immediate and wide spread. If I look at myself, see my defects, admit their pressure in me and understand the need to change them and finally decide to address them, change will happen. If everyone does the same, change happens for everyone quickly.

A combination of self-criticism and fraternal correction is a perfect recipe for becoming a good person. As a Christian we have a dual responsibility to look at ourselves and to help others to improve. These are always based on Christian principles and moral values. That means seeing ourselves as God sees us. For this we need the help of the Holy Spirit. The ancient Greek philosopher Socrates tells us that self-knowledge is the beginning of wisdom. Few of us are truly wise in this respect but most of us are focused on the faults of others and criticize them without charity. The second responsibility of a Christian is to correct others when they turn away from the true path of faith. As the Gospel says: "A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good." Today's Gospel gives us practical guidance on how to behave as disciples of Jesus. We are warned against our tendency to negative criticism, arrogance and hasty judgement of others. We must all have the basic humility to accept our shortcomings and weaknesses and have a sympathetic attitude towards others on this score because our human nature is prone to sin. In this context it is good to remember that 'error is human and pardon is divine'. Jesus is asking to us to put our own home in order before trying to reform others. This is surely an appropriate invitation to all of us we are about to begin the holy season of Lent.
