# Today's Mass Readings

Isaiah 6: 1-8;

Ps 137:

1 Corinthians 15:11;

Luke 5:1-11

#### **Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

Today is the fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. All three Scriptural passages speak of the divine call of God to three different people; Isaiah, Paul and Peter. Their response to God's call has certain similarities also. When we examine the lives of Isaiah, Paul and Peter in relation to their response to God's call something very remarkable comes to light namely a feeling of personal unworthiness and a willingness to answer the call. This is what qualifies a person to answer God's call. God chooses what is weak to shame the strong (1 Cori.1: 27). When Isaiah has his beatific vision, he says "What a wretched state I am in, for I am a man of unclean lips and live among a people of unclean lips." When God strengthens him, he is ready to take up that mission "Here I am send me". So also in the case of Paul when he speaks of himself saying "I am the least of the apostles and I persecuted the Church of God." Paul acknowledged "I am what I am only by the grace God." When he accepts his call by the grace of God he is ready to meet anything in the world for the cause of the Gospel of Christ who called him. In the Gospel we see the attitude of Peter is none other than that of personal unworthiness: 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinful man'.

God does not call the qualified but qualifies the called. True success in our lives comes from total dependence on God. A mission without God is a failed one. Simon Peter and his fellow fishermen toiled all night at sea and caught nothing. Then Peter pays out the net at his Master's word and they got an unimaginable catch, a miraculous catch of fish. We have to keep in mind that we all have a definite mission and a call from God but most of us fail to understand it because of our engagement in this noisy world, so we cannot hear the voice of God. As a Christian we have to fulfil a mission in this world, blessed is the one who knows the mission and act accordingly. Only in silence that we can hear the voice of God. Prayer, silence, scriptural reading and meditation are the means to know the will of God.


