



MY DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

Today's Gospel passage is familiar to all of us - the parable of the Prodigal Son. What was the sin of this younger son towards his father? First of all, he failed to realise the love of his father. He has a loving father but he was not satisfied with this. That is why he asked for his inheritance from the father and left home and spent his wealth with his friends and he enjoyed their company. Even though he enjoyed himself he didn't get real love from them. So long as he had wealth, his friends were with him and when he became poor everybody abandoned him and he was in despair.

The second sin was that he wasted his wealth. Wasting what we have is a sin and a crime. Even wasting food is a sin because there are people in this world longing for food to sustain their lives. All the resources in this world are for the all humanity and if we waste anything it will badly affect the people who are in need.

The merit of this son was that in course of time he realised his faults and returned home to beg for forgiveness from his father. What we learn from this son is that as human beings we may go wrong, but once we realise our faults we can return to the right path without any hesitation. Our Heavenly Father is always waiting for us whatever our sins may be, no matter how grave they are. If we approach God the Father with a contrite heart, he is always ready to forgive all our sins.

What was the sin of the elder son? He was very obedient to his father and he never wasted his father's money and he worked hard for him. All these things are well and good but he failed to understand the mind of his father. His father had a generous heart to receive his younger son. He had wasted his wealth but still he loved him. The elder son couldn't love his brother and he was unhappy about his return. Even though he had always worked with his father and was close to him, he was not close to his father's heart and he couldn't understand him. We should be able to learn from good people and try to follow their path. May we follow the example of the Father, being loving and forgiving.
