### THE THIRD SUNDAY IN THE LENT

My dear Brothers and sisters in Christ

In today's Gospel Jesus warns people to change their ways. He also tells us the parable of fig tree. God gives us many opportunities to grow in faith. We must not resist His efforts to help us mature in faith. Like a good gardener He is waiting for fruits, fruits of faith. In the first reading we see the burning bush, which represents the reality of a soul that is receptive to God's presence whereas the fig tree in the Gospel represents God's presence resisted and refused. Lent is a time of transformation in our lives. Christ is like a gardener who cultivates our hearts, uprooting what stops the divine life in us, strengthening us to bear fruit that will last into eternity. God always waits for our return to Him. Conversion means turning towards God. When we are fully immersed in worldly pleasures we cannot see God's face but see only the face of the world.

God does not cause suffering, people and circumstances do it. The people whom Pilate killed, died because of an evil ruler's wrath. Those who died in the tower collapse in Siloam were in the wrong place at the wrong time. Bad things can happen to good people. Bad things can also happen to bad people. But Jesus is calling for repentance when talking about both these incidents. We do not know when our end is coming. It is good to pray like this: "Make us worthy of the end that befits a Christian and is pleasing and proper to Your Divinity." The Lent is the right time for repentance and to receive favour in the sight of God.

- Holy Communion is to be distributed to the faithful under one kind only.
- Those who distribute Holy Communion should wear a face covering and sanitise their hands before doing so.
- Singing can take place but faithful are encouraged to wear face coverings/ mask while singing.
