In today's Gospel Jesus tells us "Watch and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs". Avarice is extreme greed for wealth and material gain. In the sight of God, avarice is a sin because extreme greed for anything material leads to sin. Anything that leads to sin should be avoided. As you know, the parable is very troubling.
