In today's Gospel we find two sisters, Martha and Mary, who welcomed Jesus to their house and they have a brother named Lazarus. As we see in the Gospel, Jesus loved this family and liked their company and enjoyed their hospitality. These three people are models of Christian life. Lazarus was the friend of Jesus. Friendship shows our intimacy with people whom we love. Our relationship with Jesus should be a personal intimacy because Jesus is our brother.

Mary was the model of worship. Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and looked at His face hearing the Words of Life that flowing from His mouth. To worship God means looking at God's face and hearing His voice in silence and meditating on them. In other words we find time to sit at God's feet in our busy lives. Normally people don't find time to sit in silence and hear the voice of God in their busy schedule of life.

Martha is the model of service. When Jesus came to their house she was busily Guest the best of engaged in servina the to her Christian life is the combination of these three things, friendship, worship, and service and of these, worship is the important. Martha was complaining to Jesus about her sister Mary not helping with her work load. Jesus taught Martha that she was worrying and fretting about so many things and yet few were needed, indeed only one. Mary had chosen the better part; it was not to be taken from her.

Jesus reminds us in today's Gospel that though we are in a busy world still we must not forget to choose the better part; finding time to sit in silence and hear the voice of God. We can only hear God's voice in silence.
