My dear Brothers and Sisters

In today's Gospel passage Jesus gives us this message: there is no need to afraid little flock for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom. God always has concern for the little ones. In the Old Testament Yahweh told the Israelites "I loved you more than all the peoples of the world because you are a tiny people and I am with you all times to help you". Also in the New Testament we see that Jesus says that at the Last Judgement: what you have done to these little ones you have done to me. God will always come to the help of the poor and the weak. When we are weak we rely on God because we cannot stand without the help of God. When we are strong and powerful in this material world, we have an overconfidence in ourselves and do not seek the ways of God. We see an exception in the Bible, King David. Even though he was a powerful king of Israel, he always sought the ways of God. He was humble before God.

In the second part of the Gospel we see the steward who was faithful and wise. He could read the mind of his master. The works that were assigned to him by his master were performed to the best of his ability. He became a worthy servant to his master and his master placed him over everything he owned. God never interferes in our freedom.
