25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflection on the Reading from the Prophet Amos

The people of Israel were a chosen race to whom God had given his Commandments so that they would know how to live in ways that pleased him. They were asked to love and serve God and to love their neighbour and care for them. The role of the Prophets in the Old Testament was to remind people of their covenant with God. Here the Prophet Amos looked at what is happening in his society and saw that it fell far short of what the Lord expected. Men were getting rich by fraud and injustice. The bushel was the measure for things like wheat, and the shekel was the local currency, so they were setting out to cheat their customers. They did not care what this meant for the poor because they were prepared to make them slaves if they couldn't pay. They key line is the last one in this text. "The Lord swears by the pride of Jacob, "Never will I forget a single thing you have done"."

God saw and took note of what was happening and there was a price to pay. The Northern Kingdom was defeated and the wealthy lost all their riches.

This text has a very modern feel to it. We recognise talk of paying more for less, and the wealthy looking on while the poor struggle. What is amazing is that this text was written about 750BC! God's message remains true also. He still sees and cares about the suffering of the poor and there are still prophets, like Pope Francis, warning that if people don't change their ways there will be a price to pay. May we hear the voice of the modern prophets and may we learn to care for God's world and the people He has made.
