Reflection for the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The letter to Philemon

This letter is unlike any other writing that we have from St. Paul. He is a prisoner in Rome and "an old man now". It is a personal letter, written "in his own handwriting" to Philemon, who is one of his converts. In it he appeals for a runaway slave called Onesimus. In the Roman world, slavery was everywhere and considered a normal state of affairs. Slaves had no rights at all and a runaway could be killed by his master if he were captured. It is this context that Paul is writing this letter.

Paul is asking Philemon to welcome back Onesimus as a fellow Christian, now a brother in the Lord. Paul refers to him as a blood-brother and master and slave may well have had the same father. Onesimus has been with Paul and a very useful member of his team. Now Paul is sending him back so that he can be restored to the household where he belongs. Paul says that Onesimus is coming on his behalf and asks that he be made welcome. We do not know what happened to Onesimus, but I think we can assume that Paul's wishes were honoured as we have this letter preserved in the Bible. This is a letter about forgiveness, as Philemon is asked to forgive his slave, and trust, as Onesimus has to trust that his master will receive him. It is a letter written with love for both people involved, whose lives have been transformed by their faith in Jesus.
