In today's First Reading from the Book of Exodus, we see Moses praying for success in battle with the Amalekites. One interesting thing about this story is that Moses does not seem to say anything. Instead he raises his hands in prayer to God and when he gets tired he is helped by Aaron and Hur to keep his arms raised. Not only is Moses praying but his friends are praying with and for him and their prayer is heard.
