My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

In today's Gospel Jesus tells about the signs of the Second Coming of the Son of Man and the final judgement. First of all, Jesus prophesied the destruction of the beautiful Temple of Jerusalem, the centre of Jewish worship. It has an inner meaning the destruction of the Jerusalem Temple is the symbol of the end of Old Testament and the beginning of the New Testament. By the destruction of the Temple, the Jewish sacrifice of animals came to a close and the new sacrifice began, the memorial of Jesus' Sacrifice on the cross.

The Son of Man will come in glory at the Second Coming and Jesus warned about the false prophets who will come to deceive the people. Jesus told his Disciples about the signs of His coming, war, earthquake and famine. These calamities will badly affect all people on earth and no one can save himself.

Before all this happens there will be great persecution for those who believe in Him. Those who withstand will be saved. It is the time for witnessing for Christ. This witness comes at a high price, 'you will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives'.

Jesus tells us to be prepared and we need both spiritual and human preparation. Spiritual preparation here means to be in communion with God by worship and by reading His Word and human preparation means to do our duty to the best of our ability, because we have to give an account of our lives before the Son of Man when He appears to judge the living and the dead.
