DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST

The Gospel Reading of this Sunday speaks of discipleship. Just as Jesus called and sent the first twelve Apostles, he is also calling and sending us for a mission. In other words, discipleship entails a mission. We are called therefore to do something in the vineyard where "the harvest is ready but the laborers are few".

During the time of Jesus, many people were in need of help. It is the same in our own time, if not, more so. Just look around us or read the newspaper, people everywhere are hungry for the Good News, hungry for physical food, and are in need of healing as well as comfort. Who will proclaim the Kingdom of God to them and tend to their needs?

And to do all these things for free? For it is Jesus whom we actually serve and it is Jesus who will bless us and give us what is due whether at the present time and in the life everlasting.
