Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

There are some questions for which there are no intellectually satisfactory answers. One such question is the presence of evil in the world. Why does the good Lord allow "the weed to grow together with the wheat"? All that we can do is to face the reality that good and evil coexist in this world.

We live in an imperfect world. There are earthquakes that kill thousands, epidemics that wipe out many, floods and droughts that impoverish many. There is sickness and famine. This is how the world is, and we have to live with this imperfect world and when we look into ourselves we notice we too are imperfect. There are plenty of defects and shortcomings in each of us and however much we try, we will continue to be imperfect. We live in an imperfect world, among imperfect people, and we ourselves are imperfect. And we have to learn to live with it.

God tolerates evil in the world, in every person and within me. If God tolerates evil, I too must tolerate it and learn to live with it. If the world with all its defects is good enough for God, it must be good enough for me too. By conforming our attitude to God's attitude to things and people, we fall in line with God's thinking and learn to live with evil at all levels. Presence of evil is universal but that must not prevent us, imperfect humans, from doing what we can in an imperfect world, with imperfect people. When we reflect about evil we must not forget the fact that God has a way of bringing out good out of evil. The sale of Joseph to the Egyptians led to the salvation of Jacob and his sons. The crucifixion of Jesus led to the salvation of the world.
