Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday we reflect on the faith and humility of the Canaanite woman. The Canaanite woman is from the region of Tyre and Sidon. This woman represents the Gentiles. The Lord leaves Jewish territory, and the Canaanite woman comes out from her Gentile territory. He left the Jews behind, and the woman was leaving behind idolatry. This Canaanite woman recognized who Jesus is. St. Epiphanius says that what the Gentiles had lost, she found through her faith.

The Canaanite woman wants Jesus to bring healing and rescue for her daughter. Her daughter has been led astray by idolatry and sin and is possessed by a demon. This woman continues to cry out after Jesus to the point that the disciples feel like something needs to be done. It is not because Jesus does not want to give her the gift that he delays but because he wants to reveal her faith. Jesus uses the term *dog* because of the Gentiles' unclean lifestyle and proneness to idolatry, while he calls the Jews *children*. The woman manifests her humility, saying, "Yes, Lord, I am a dog. I desire crumbs." Jesus uses the word *bread* to speak of his teaching and his salvific actions. The Canaanite woman tries to say, "you came to the Jews, and they didn't want you. What they turned down give to us." By healing her daughter as a reward for her faith, Jesus honours the Canaanite woman who is highly praised for humility.

In a similar way, the centurion said with humility, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed." He did not receive the Lord under his roof; he received him in his heart. The more humble a person is, the more receptive and full he becomes.
