Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

St. Teresa of Avila was on a journey. It was bitterly cold, a dark night in winter. It started raining and a wheel of the chariot came off. So she had to spend the whole night there on the road. In her bitterness she cried to the Lord, "Lord, why do you treat me like this". "This is how I treat my friends", said the Lord. "Oh, I see! That is why you have so few friends", responded Teresa.

Suffering is difficult to understand. But Jesus is absolutely clear about his teaching about suffering. "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me." No discipleship is possible without suffering. Suffering is a universal experience. Suffering is an evil. So there is no point in glorifying suffering for its own sake. Instead we must fight against it.

Jesus did not come to take away our suffering but to give meaning to our suffering. Suffering is not the end, death is not the end; resurrection is the end. The last word about our human existence is not suffering and death but resurrection and fullness of life with him. The cross could not hold on to Jesus for long, the tomb could not lock him up for ever. The cross had to surrender him; and the tomb had to give him up on the third day. In the same manner we too will triumph over suffering and death.

When we are caught up in our daily toil, failures and disappointment, pain and tragedy, sickness or death of a loved one, we should not forget the good news proclaimed by Lord Jesus: suffering is not the end, death is not the end; resurrection is the end. Jesus has conquered suffering and death.
