Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

Today we are invited to reflect on an extraordinary event in the life of Jesus, the moment He was transfigured in the presence of His disciples, Peter, James and John. The importance of this event is shown by the fact that it is described in detail in three of the Gospels. This takes place at a critical moment in the life of Jesus. Jesus has left behind his beloved Galilee and turned his face towards Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet the same fate as the prophets before him. The transfiguration experience was important not only for Jesus but also for his beloved disciples, Peter, James, and John. Their eyes were opened and they catch a glimpse of Jesus in His glory, and their ears were opened to hear the divine confirmation of Jesus' identity as the beloved Son to whom they are commanded to listen. Captivated by the experience, Peter wants to remain on the mountain in the exalted company of Elijah, Moses and Jesus. However, this is not to be. This luminous moment passes and the three disciples find themselves alone with Jesus who warns them not to tell anyone what they have witnessed until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. We are told that the disciples observed his warning faithfully but continued to reflect on what they had seen and heard, wondering what it all meant.

Today's Gospel prompts us to recall transfiguration moments in our own lives, moments when we caught a glimpse of a transcendent beauty beyond the horizon of the habitual. Lent is a time to recall such moments in our own lives and draw strength from them. It is a time to trust in the Lord, like Abraham. It is a time to withdraw to the mountain with Jesus, to listen to Him and allow Him to lead us on our journey towards Easter.
