Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Education Sunday is observed on September 8 this year. It marks the beginning of the academic year with a focus on praying for those in our Catholic schools, colleges and universities. Many of the first schools and universities were founded by the Church, which has always esteemed education as integral to the Christian journey. Catholic educators hold a unique role in positively influencing young lives through faith and hope. The success of this mission depends on the dedication of school staff, governors, and directors, who ensure that Catholic Social Teaching is lived and appreciated on a daily basis. This year's theme for Education Sunday is drawn from its Gospel reading of Mark 7:31-37: He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.

Church documents says that a true education is one that prepares students for eternal life, as well as enabling them to discern and follow their vocation on this earth. Going to school means opening one's mind and heart to reality, in the wealth of its aspects, of its dimensions. School teaches us to understand reality. 'The family is the first core for relationships: the relationship with one's father and mother and with one's brothers and sisters is the basis, and it always accompanies us in life. But at school we "socialise": we meet people who are different from us, different in age, culture, roots, abilities. School is the first society that integrates the family. Family and school are complementary. Journey at school enables students to learn three languages that a mature person should know how to express: the language of the mind, the language of the heart and the language of the hands. It is to think what one feels and what one does; to feel deeply what one thinks and what one does; and to do well what one thinks and what one feels.' Time spent at school should not only equip us for life in the world but instil in us a transcendent love for knowledge and a desire to seek truth and wisdom.
